Woodlands Production's spring concert "Folk Songs and Songs for Folks" has music for everyone. Folks of all ages will be tapping their toes to both unfamiliar and easily recognizable tunes. The Woodlands Brass will kick off the program with folk songs in a mix of styles...calypso, march, Irish, English. The strings will follow with a couple of folk songs in the classical mode (Beethoven, Schumann) as well as arrangements of Irish and English tunes. The RingJoy Handbell Choir will ring out familiar tunes. "Singin' in the Rain" will "Rocka Your Soul". Both the String Ensemble and the Bell Choir are under the direction of Linda Colman.

After a brief intermission the Woodland Chorus, under Ron Bacon, will perform "Four English Folk Songs" by R. Vaughan Williams and some surprise specials. Lastly the Woodland Concert Band will mix it up with "Ricochet", a contemporary band piece with musical quotes from a famous classical piece, a circus march paying tribute to the demise of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey, and Aaron Copland's "Variations on a Shaker Melody." Kettle Falls School district band director, Gary Killings, is our guest conductor for this concert.

It is sure to be a fun listening experience, with something to please every member of the family.

Performances are at the Woodland Theatre in Kettle Falls on Saturday, April 29th at 7:00 PM and Sunday, April 30th at 2:00 PM. Ticket will be sold at the door only, \$8 for adults and \$5.00 for students and seniors.

Everything Old is Almost New Again

We can now imagine the Kettle Falls Theater, built in 1940 by Henry Wood, will continue into the future as a dynamic venue for the performing arts.

Wide-spread community support and diligent stewardship have kept the theatre humming since the original members of the current Woodland Productions made it their performance base in 1978.

Beginning in 2015 the Grants/Funding Committee of Woodland Board of Directors has brought to completion two major projects and added a desirable technology for those with hearing loss.


- Assistive Hearing Devices by Williams Sound, is now available thanks to a grant from Empire Health Foundation.
- A rebuilt smooth stage surface is in place for dance and set movements, thanks to funding from Colville Vinson Fund and the extensive efforts of Sean Taboloff.
- A three part heating and ventilation system with air conditioning and improvements in weatherization is working thanks in part to a Community Strategies Grant from Inland NW Community Foundation and the efforts of Andrew Urbaniak.

The best is yet to come!

- Plans are in the works for a 2017 façade facelift, returning the theatre to its more iconic look, including a flat front roof, permanent signs and a neon-lit tower, similar to the 1940's original.
- Funding for new permanent signs has already been committed by the Colville Vinson Fund and will be installed as part of the facelift.
- Safety improvements to the handicap exit, including hand rails and a roof to shed snow and rain, are also being planned.
- Perhaps last in this series, will be a 2018 project to replace the deteriorating stucco on the back portion of the theatre and enclose the porch, soffits and gable ends.

With a new cooling system, Woodland Productions is now ready for summer events. So stay tuned. There are currently four grants to address our remaining facility's needs, either applied for or planned. Each grant requires matching funds to be successful, and that is where you can make a difference. Friends of Woodland Theatre, Major Donors and Woodland members who volunteer their valuable time provide matching funds for every grant application.
