The Understory

Stories connect us to one another, to our past, and can help form a collective understanding of our present and our future. Woodland Productions will pilot a new community arts storytelling program. The series, called "The Understory", offers an opportunity to look under the canopy of our community as local storytellers share brief glimpses into their personal life experiences. Each event will feature a unifying theme, although the content of the stories may be widely varied.

Join us at Happy Dell Amphitheater on **Friday, September 10th** for a night of true, personal stories brought to you live by community members. Our goal at this initial event is to gauge interest in future opportunities for our community to give voice to their own stories, to the benefit of both the storytellers and fellow Woodland Theater patrons. From clearing out the backstage in February and March to demolition, over 600 hours of volunteer labor have saved Woodland thousands of dollars. Now comes the expensive part. The unit of plywood donated by Boise Cascade did 2/3rds of the floor and Vaagens donation of lumber for all the wall and ceiling framing will save even more. The Vinson Fund will cover much of the cost of a handicap lift to be installed at the end of the project. Every donation from the community makes a huge difference.

Still with a costly electrical installation, heating and cooling reconfiguration, plumbing and insulation, Woodland estimates a need for an additional \$10,000 to complete the project.

Funds could come from 10 donations of \$1000 or 100 donations of \$100. Traditionally donations have come in by check, allowing Woodland to acknowledge and send receipts to each donor.
